

The UEF5+WPC59 Congress “*For Climate Action, Urban Finance - Climate-responsive Planning for Equitable Places & Communities*” is jointly organised by the Urban Economy Forum (<https://www.ueforum.org/>) and ISOCARP (<https://isocarp.org/>) and will take place this 10-13 October in Toronto, Canada.

The Urban Economy Forum, an international organisation that advocates for the implementation of Sustainable Development Goals, in particular SDG11 “Sustainable Cities and Communities” and ISOCARP, the International Society of City and Regional Planners with almost six decades of contributing to knowledge for better cities, are co-organising this event to provoke a dialogue between professional planners, policymakers, city leaders, Governments, academia, financial institutions, entrepreneurs, and the civil society.
